

## **Wood Encouragement Policy**

## **Background**

At its May 2015 meeting, the MAV State Council resolved that the MAV endorse Latrobe City Council's Wood Encouragement Policy and accept it as a policy of the MAV.

## **Purpose**

In line with the Latrobe City Council's Wood Encouragement Policy, this Wood Encouragement Policy seeks to:

- help stimulate sustainable economic development within the Victorian timber and wood products industry and encourage value adding products within the timber industry
- encourage councils to consider the use of wood in the construction and fit out of council buildings and infrastructure
- encourage councils to recognise the benefits that make wood a smart choice for council buildings and infrastructure
- encourage councils to share information and encourage education regarding the benefits of using wood in construction and fit out of buildings and infrastructure
- demonstrate local and national leadership by adopting this policy
- encourage councils to consider the use of wood in demonstration projects across the municipality

## **Implementation**

The MAV recognises the importance of the Victorian forest and wood products industry to regional employment and economic development.

The Latrobe City Council Wood Encouragement Policy sets out a number of actions that councils can take to increase utilisation of wood in council assets, namely:

- 1. Ensuring that all briefs for new Council projects incorporate the requirement to use wood as the preferred material for both construction and fit out purposes, where wood is deemed a suitable material for the proposed application;
- 2. Seeking those who can find, practical, efficient, versatile and cost-effective building and design solutions using wood when sourcing design and architectural expertise;
- 3. Ensuring that all comparisons to the cost of building with other materials will take into account all long-term and life cycle benefits of using wood;
- 4. Where possible, sourcing locally produced wood products for construction and fit out purposes;
- 5. Being a champion of the forest and wood products industry, by establishing a Wood Encouragement Policy and demonstrating commitment to the further development of the local forest and wood products industry.

- 6. Actively seeking demonstration projects that showcase the use of wood within the municipality.
- 7. Actively working to attract new, innovative wood products manufacturers to the municipality.

In using wood as a preferred construction material for council infrastructure, councils are encouraged to have regard to:

- 1. The utilisation of wood products that meet the Australian Forest Standard, Program for the Endorsement of Forest Certification and / or Forest Stewardship Council certifications:
- 2. Maintenance required throughout the life of the project;
- 3. Pest and fungus protection; and
- 4. Using wood only when it is the right material for the selected application

This policy will be circulated to all councils and will be made available on the MAV website.
